Description

In 2020 it was five years ago that Pope Francis promulgated his encyclical *Laudato si'*. In this encyclical, the Pope called for a new dialogue in shaping the planet's future: "We need a conversation which includes everyone, since the environmental challenge we are undergoing, and its human roots, concern and affect us all" (*Laudato si'*, No. 14). In order to commemorate this jubilee, Cardinal Stefan Wyszyński University, Warsaw, Missio Aachen and Nijmegen Institute for Mission Studies (NIM) organized a conference on *Laudato si'* and Mission. Various topics were discussed such as the historical background of *Laudato si'*, *Laudato si'* as a challenge for a missionary spirituality, socio-ethical perspectives of *Laudato si'*, and Interdisciplinary and interreligious perspectives of *Laudato si'*. The contributions are now published as European Mission Studies No. 3. In this NIM Symposium, we will present and discuss this new book.
